Advent

The early Christians, coming out of a pagan background, began to reorganize their calendars to leave out pagan holidays and references (such as the month of “March,” named for Mars, the Roman god of war, or “August,” a month to honor Caesar Augustus, the deified emperor). Following Jewish practice, they set up a series of holy days and seasons reflecting events in salvation history.

The month before Christmas was set apart as preparation for that holy day, as well as to focus on personal preparedness for Jesus’ yet-to-come second advent (second “coming”). It also was the first month of the “Christian” calendar; in the same way that Sunday was used to look back at the previous week and thank God for His blessings, and look ahead to the coming week and ask His guidance, Advent was a month to look back over the previous year and ahead to the opening year. Christmas wasn’t seen as closing the old year but opening the new. It is a beginning, not an end.

Our Advent guide booklets are one means to turn us from our pagan culture and to practice a Christian perspective in these busy weeks. You might also try to think of the Advent season as the beginning of the year ahead, not just a lead-up to Christmas. Let me know if you try this and find it making a difference in your outlook.
